Santa Monica, CA (April 13, 2017) -- *A Classy Broad: Marcia's Adventures in Hollywood*, the fascinating feature-length documentary film about a Jewish girl from San Antonio who shattered Hollywood's glass ceiling, will have its LA premiere at Jewish Women's Theatre (JWT) in Santa Monica on Sunday, April 23 at 10 am.

A Classy Broad, directed and produced by Anne Goursaud, tells the story of Marcia Nasatir, the first woman vice-president of a film studio, who produced the *The Big Chill* and became a major force in Hollywood. The movie premiere will be followed by a post-screening discussion with both Nasatir and Goursaud.

JWT Board Member Arlene Sarner, explains, "Even with extraordinary talent, Marcia needed to fight with and outwit her male detractors all the way to the top. Now 90 years old, she is still doing it."

A Classy Broad will be the first-ever movie premier hosted by JWT. "Marcia's spirit is an inspiration to generations of women and men in the film industry and beyond," Sarner explained.

This "untold story" follows Nasatir's career from lone female literary agent in New York to United Artists studio where she became the first female VP in charge of production. Unceremoniously dismissed, she became an independent producer. As an early project, she took on *The Big Chill*, a now classic film that had been turned down by seventeen companies. Lawrence Kasdan, the writer/director credits Nasatir for getting it made.
